

Non-Resident Scholarships

Non-resident students will be considered for the following awards automatically upon application for admission to the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs beginning in 2008-2009. The Financial Aid Office will inform each recipient by letter. Students must accept the award within two weeks of the initial offer by returning the acceptance form provided.

Chancellor's Non-Resident Scholarship for Undergraduate Students

\$20,000 /Four Years (\$5,000/Academic Year)

- Full-time undergraduate students in a degree seeking program
- Paying non-resident tuition
- Citizen or permanent resident of the US

- Entering First Time Freshman students must have these requirements or contribute to the enrichment of campus diversity:
 - ACT score of 24 or above OR
 - SAT score of 1080 or above AND
 - Graduated in the top 25 percent of their high school graduating class

- Transfer students must have these requirements or contribute to the enrichment of campus diversity:
 - More than 30 semester hours of transferable credits AND
 - GPA of 3.0 or higher

- Undergraduate awards are renewable as long as the student continues to be a non-resident, is enrolled full-time, and maintains at least a cumulative 3.0 GPA, for up to four years.

Chancellor's Non-Resident Scholarships for Graduate Students

\$2,000 or \$4,000 / Academic Year

- Graduate students must have:
 - At least a 3.5 Cumulative GPA from the institution that granted their undergraduate degree to qualify for the \$4,000 Merit Scholarship.
 - At least a 3.0 Cumulative GPA from the institution that granted their undergraduate degree to qualify for the \$2,000 Scholarship.

- Graduate students may only receive one of the Chancellor's Non-Resident Scholarships for Graduate Students

- Graduate awards are typically not renewable because the student is expected to establish Colorado residency by the second year of their program.

Chancellor's Non-Resident Housing Scholarship

\$2000 / Academic Year

Non-Resident students that live in the Housing Village or Alpine Village and are financially needy are eligible. Students, upon application for admission to the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, and the receipt of the FAFSA, will automatically be considered for the following award. The Financial Aid Office will inform each recipient by letter. Students that meet the criteria for both the academic scholarship and housing scholarship may have both.

- Full-time undergraduate and graduate students in a degree seeking program
- Paying non-resident tuition
- Demonstrate financial need by completing the FAFSA
- Citizen or permanent resident of the US
- Renewable as long as the student continues to be a non-resident, is enrolled full-time, demonstrates financial need by completing the FAFSA by April 1st and maintains at least a cumulative 3.0 GPA for up to four years.
