Dr. Anthony (Tony) Kinkel, President of Pikes Peak Community College, is the former Executive Director of the Maryland Association of Community Colleges. Tony spent 15 years in the Minnesota State Legislature and represented Minnesota on the Education Commission of the

States. He received his Doctor's degree in Higher Education Administration from the University of Minnesota, where he was a member of the Leadership Academy program. Locally, he serves on the boards of Goodwill Industries, The Urban League of the Pikes Peak Region, Inc., and the UCCS College of Education Advisory Board.

John Register, a three-time All-American at the University of Arkansas, has also won 9 gold medals in Armed Services Competition. Following an athletic injury which eventually led to the amputation of his left leg, John's fighting spirit enabled him to qualify for the 1996 Paralympic Team as a swimmer. Not restricting himself to the swimming pool, John later earned the silver medal in the long jump at the 2000 Paralympic Games, setting the American long jump record in the process. John joined the United States Olympic Committee in 2003 and now manages the Paralympic Academy Youth Outreach Program, as well as directing the USOC's Paralympic Military Program.



Kyle H. Hybl, is Vice President and General Counsel for El Pomar Foundation and General Counsel for the Broadmoor Hotel. A Regent to the University of Colorado system, Mr. Hybl is on the Board of Directors for the Air Force Academy Foundation, Colorado Springs World Arena, Goodwill Industries of Colorado Springs Foundation, and NFIB Young Entrepreneur Foundation. Kyle is also a graduate of the University of Colorado, Boulder, where he received both his Bachelor of Arts and Juris Doctor degrees.



State Senator John Morse, a member of the Colorado State Senate since 2006, serves as Chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee, a member of the Health and Human Services Committee, the Legislative Legal Services Committee, and the Ethics Board. A former detective and sergeant with the Colorado Springs Police Department, John also served as Fountain Police Department Chief of Police. John holds an MBA degree from Regis University, an MPA from the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, and a Ph.D. in Public Affairs from the University of Colorado Denver.

Dr. Fred Crowley, a senior instructor in the College of Business at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, is the senior economist for the Southern Colorado Economic Forum in the College of Business and also serves as the Forum's Associate Director. Trained in quantitative methods in urban and regional planning, urban economics and corporate financial theory, Fred has published scholarly articles in the finest journals in his field, including *Urban Studies*, *Financial Review*, and *The Journal of Energy and Development*.
