### Objectives:

- ◆ The Department of Military Science was established with the following purposes:
  - ◇ To recruit, retain, train, and commission upon graduation qualified students for service as second lieutenants in the United States Army
  - ◇ To provide students an opportunity to study and learn the processes of leadership and management through classroom and hands-on experience; and
  - ◇ To instill in the individual students the values, attributes, and skills necessary to be successful leaders in the future, whether in the military or in civilian careers.
- ◆ Students in the Military Science program will:
  - ◇ Become familiar with the principles of leadership and decision making in the classroom and then apply those principles in positions of responsibility while participating in program activities (leadership labs, physical training, etc.).
  - ◇ Be expected to participate in leadership labs and will be encouraged to participate in other ROTC activities (physical training, formal functions, etc.) to gain an understanding and appreciation of the processes of a formal organization. Physical training is required for all contracted students.
  - ◇ Prepare for careers in the Army either on active duty or in the Reserve Components (Army Reserve or Army National Guard).
- ◆ A minor in Military Science is available to qualified students:
  - ◇ Participants in the minor program must be contracted in the Army ROTC Advanced Course.
  - ◇ Final award of this minor is dependent on the receipt and acceptance after graduation from CU-Colorado Springs of a commission in the U.S. Army as a second lieutenant.
  - ◇ Advanced Camp (MS 303) is mandatory for all contracted cadets. However, attendance at Advanced Camp is not contingent on taking the course for credit. Only those students seeking the minor are required to take the course for credit. Students may not retroactively seek credit for attendance at Advanced Camp.
  - ◇ All 18 hours required for a minor in Military Science must be taken at CU-Colorado Springs. Students transferring from another Army ROTC program to the program at UCCS may petition to the Professor of Military Science for an exception to this policy.
  - ◇ There are no electives applicable to this minor.
