Program Details

OVERVIEW

CU in D.C. is a program for students who want to put classroom learning into real world action. The program combines a professional internship in the daytime, with CU classroom courses in the evening in Washington D.C.

CU in D.C. is a for-credit internship program open to undergraduate students in majors across the entire campus, as well as to undergraduate students on the CU Denver and CU Colorado Springs campuses. Students intern in a wide variety of sectors in D.C., such as: political offices, government agencies, nonprofits, think-tanks, and businesses.

ELIGIBILITY

Must be a fully-enrolled CU student, have junior standing or completion of 60 credits, and have a 3.0 GPA.

HOUSING & COSTS

Students live in group housing with other CU in D.C. students in a centrally-located neighborhood in Washington D.C.

HOW TO APPLY

Apply online at <https://cuindc.colorado.edu>. Your application will be reviewed and if you are a suitable program candidate, you will advance to an interview round. Students are then notified about whether they have been accepted into the program.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Students can submit applications to the program at any time, but upcoming application deadlines are as follows: October 30, 2017 (for Spring 2018 participation); March 5, 2018 (for Summer 2018 participation); June 4, 2018 (for Fall 2018 participation).
