- facilitate campus-community partnerships.

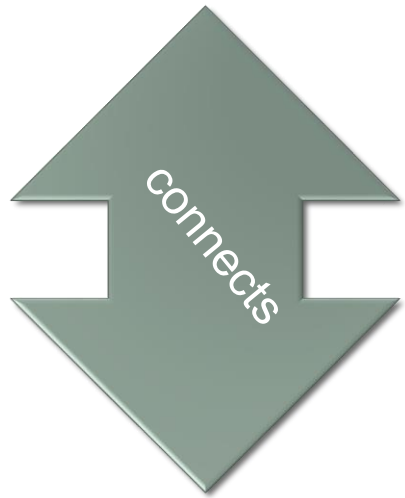
These partnerships significantly contribute to student learning, advance faculty teaching and research, support UCCS programs, and positively contribute to the Colorado Springs community.

Community Engagement

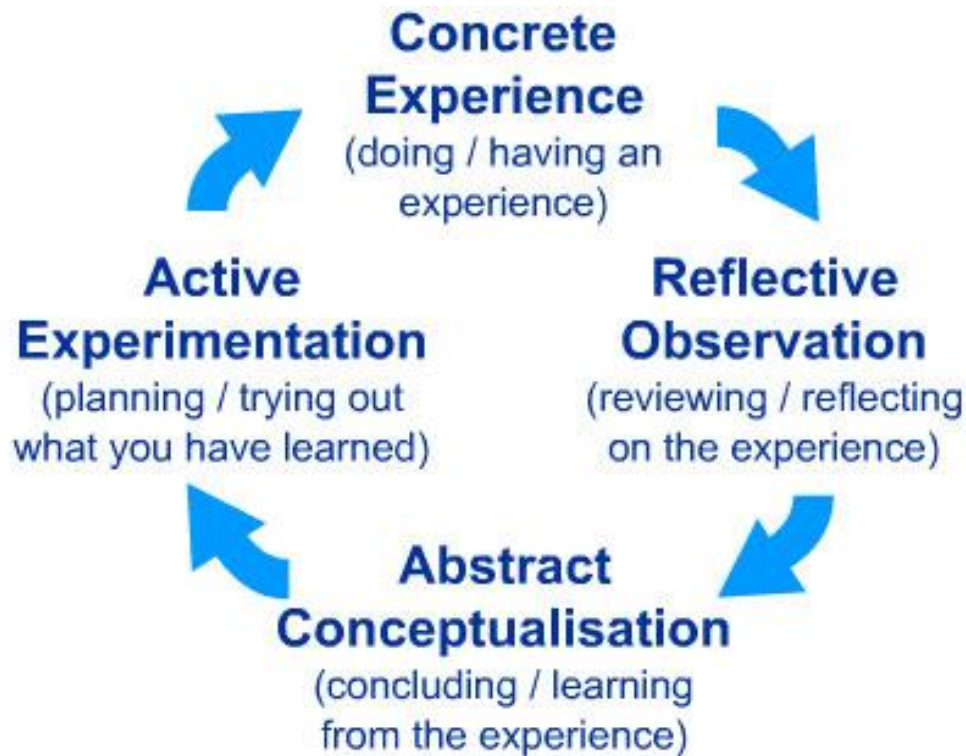
- engage faculty with the community in ways that benefit the community and advance the faculty member's teaching, scholarship, and service responsibilities.
